Together with our resilient team members, we were focused on driving change in 2021. We began the year with great hope for our future after receiving an amazing \$5 million gift from philanthropist MacKenzie Scott at the close of 2020. In addition, we continued to build Mission Services offerings, grow Business Services in industrial sewing and assembly, as well as have a tremendous year in Retail and Ecommerce operations. Much was achieved through teamwork, even while the pandemic continued to create an uncertain world. We again cannot find enough superlatives to share our sincere appreciation for our team members' flexibility, perseverance and dedication to Goodwill's mission and its safe operations.

We are also thankful for the more than 328,000 donors and nearly 860,000 shoppers. With their support, the agency was able to serve 11,328 people in our community with job search assistance, training and other services.

Amazing Gift Driving Change Within
Goodwill A key focus for the agency is
creating a sustainable plan for the gift from
Ms. Scott. We kicked off planning by engaging
76 fellow agencies and organizations to
determine the top barriers to building a better life
for people in our community. Three barriers
kept rising to the top: filling a community
resource navigator void, addressing transportation
barriers and bridging the digital divide.

Driving Change with Reliable Transportation Supports The main focus has been building reliable transportation supports. During the second quarter, we extended our Summit county current bus pass program to incorporate our entire service territory including Portage, Medina, Ashland and Richland counties. Current transportation support offerings include:

 Individual Bus Pass Assistance: Individuals can request bus pass vouchers for daily passes or monthly passes, limited to equivalent of one monthly pass annually.

- Community Agency/Organization Assistance:
 Agencies can complete an application for
 multiple passes to distribute to their clients
 individually.
- Pilot Fuel Assistance Program: Existing community partner agencies can request fuel cards for their clients.

By the end of 2021, five new agencies applied for extended bus pass services and 1,600 bus passes were distributed. In addition, nine agencies participated in the pilot fuel assistance program, receiving a total of 318 fuel cards. Along with these programs, we are exploring ideas to support vehicle operations barriers such as license or insurance reinstatement/procurement and vehicle repair or financing.

Driving Change In 2022 & Beyond Moving forward in 2022, our 95th year of service, we will refine our transportation supports while the Mission Services team continues to deliver traditional vocational services, youth services, employee development and virtual services to those in need. The Business Services team will look for further opportunities to expand its services in light assembly, industrial sewing and other business lines. Meanwhile, our Retail and Ecommerce teams will continue to make shopping and donating as safe as possible for all. Thank you for coming along for the ride as we continue to drive change.

Kevin Finds Support For Successful Reentry & Focusing On Future Instead Of Past

Kevin began his connection with Goodwill when he attended its Employment Readiness Assistance Program while incarcerated. Upon his release in April 2021 he was referred to the Richland County Citizen Circle, which Goodwill is the lead agency and facilitator. Kevin knew successful reentry was largely based on employment, education, and for him a home as well as transportation. Upon release, he first was living in transitional housing. During his stay, Kevin applied for a position at a local homeless shelter and was hired as a third shift monitor and case manager helping others in need of emergency shelter as well as services. In addition, while continuing to work at the shelter he found an additional second-shift position at a local manufacturer of motor vehicle parts. Now with work, he moved onto his next goals of transportation and a home. With help from the Citizen Circle, Kevin received his driver's license, car, purchased a home under a land contract and received help furnishing his home. Also to help furnish his home, he received a gift card from Goodwill's Elizabeth Clark Emergency Fund to purchase household goods and furniture. Through Kevin's determination, hope and support from the




Citizen Circle as well as Goodwill, he cannot believe how much his life has transformed. Currently, he is being trained for a supervisory position at the local manufacturing firm he is working at and is dedicated to mentoring others struggling with the social challenges of transitioning back into society.

Work Experience Helps John Gain Skills & Prepare For Future


John first came to Goodwill in its high school work experience program. At that time he was working on gaining skills to prepare him for the work world after graduation. In addition to skills training during the school year, John participated in a summer youth program through Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities at a local grocery store. Along with this summer position, came the challenge of getting to work for John since he did not have transportation. Goodwill helped John arrange transportation, the funds to pay for it and helped teach him how to use public transportation. After his high school graduation, he was referred to Goodwill for job development services to help him find a position. John chose a goal of working in retail due to his positive summer youth program experience at the grocery store. He attended an open interview session at another branch of the same grocery store chain. John was hired on the spot as a bagger due to his experience and positive attitude. In order to ensure his success in his new role, John received job coaching services to help with orientation and job performance. Today John is doing very well in



his position and is proud of all he has achieved to date. His manager commented on John's perseverance. Next while continuing to work, John plans to attend community college to pursue a degree in early childhood education, which he also took while in high school.

Applying Learned Work And Life Skills Helps Lichelle Reach Goals

Lichelle came to Goodwill to gain work experience in retail through a program called BOSS, Building Opportunities for Sustained Success, funded by the Summit County Department of Job & Family Services. The program works with youth ages 14-24 to help them grow both work and life skills, all in an effort to create independence. For Lichelle, her love of fashion and goal to someday have her own salon drew her to choose Goodwill for her work experience. While in the program, Lichelle participated in some life skills and employment readiness classes as well as grew her confidence in communicating with customers. She first worked at Goodwill's Waterloo store where she mastered all tasks in the processing area as well as the retail sales floor. She excelled at providing outstanding sales and customer service to our retail customers. Next she moved to Goodwill's boutique, where she continued to successfully apply all the skills she had mastered. Throughout her training, one of Lichelle's main goals was to obtain reliable transportation. Her determination paid off! Thanks to her hard work and dedication she was able to purchase a vehicle. We are so proud of Lichelle for successfully



applying the skills she learned at Goodwill to land a new position in housekeeping at a local hospital. Lichelle's new position provides her opportunities for additional training in the healthcare field, which is of great interest while she works on building the dream of opening her own salon one day.
