



John Groce Men's Basketball Head Coach **University of Akron**



John Groce stepped into the Akron Zips head coaching position on April 6, 2017. He recently completed his fifth season at Akron with a 94-59 overall record, including a 63-25 mark over the last three seasons. In Mid-American Conference play, the Zips are 54-38 under Coach Groce and 40-16 over the last three years, owning the best winning percentage (.714) in the league!

Coach Groce has a long history of building championship caliber teams and all-around successful young men. The program's mission is "to be impactful", and the vision "One Akron" is embraced by everyone in the program, and Coach Groce is known for saying "it takes a village."

During his 27-year coaching career, he has helped coach teams to 19 postseason appearances in 24 opportunities, including six regular season conference championships, eight conference tournament championships, a National Runner-up, an Elite 8, an NCAA Sweet 16 and seven Round of 32 appearances. During his coaching career, his teams have not only shown consistent success on the court but have demonstrated sustained excellence in the classroom as well.

Prior to joining the Zips, Coach Groce served as head basketball coach at the University of Illinois for five seasons. In his first year, the Illini started 12-0 in 2013, the best start for a first-year coach in the team's modern history. Prior to moving to head coach of Illinois, he spent four seasons as head coach at Ohio University. In that role, he led the Bobcats to an 85-56 record as well as Mid-American Conference Tournament titles and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2010 and 2012.

Coach John Groce first began his career as an American college basketball coach at Taylor University in Upland, Indiana. Born in Muncie, Indiana, Groce graduated from Danville Community High School then went on to attend Taylor University. He played basketball at Taylor University and began his coaching career in 1993 as an assistant for his alma mater. He currently resides in Richfield, Ohio with his wife Allison and their three children.

Making a difference in people's lives takes many forms. Sometimes making a difference comes in literally small ways. A Goodwill Elizabeth Clark Emergency Fund recipient, Sandra, found herself making a difference in three small lives.

Selflessly, and at their own expense, she and her family had taken in three small children. The children needed someone to look after them and understand what they were experiencing. Having three more people to feed and clothe was a drain on their budget, but they were steadfast in their commitment to provide a safe, healthy home environment.

With almost no time to plan or prepare, it was imperative that the children have beds to sleep in. Goodwill's vocational services team member quickly collaborated with the store manager, and that night the children all slept securely in beds of their own.
